AN ORDINANCE IMPOSING A LICENSE TAY ITE EACH DOG. AND THE AMOUNTS AN ORDINANCE IMPOSING A LICENSE TAX UPON THE OWNER AND HARBORER OF DOGS, FIXING THE AMOUNT OF SAID TAX, REQUIRING A LICENSE FOR EACH DOG, AUTHORIZING THE DESTRUCTION OF DOGS, PRESCRIBING A PENALTIFOR VIOLATIONS, ESTABLISHING THE OFFICE OF THE VILLAGE POUND MASTER, REPEALING ORDINANCE NO. OF THE VILLAGE OF CLARK FORK AND ANY OTHER ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH, AND PROVIDING FOR THE PUBLICATION OF THIS ORDINANCE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CHAIRMAN AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF CLARK FORK, IDAHO: by dred to be the control of the con

Section 1. No person owning or keeping a dog of either sex within the corporate limits of the Village of Clark Fork shall permit any such dog to run at large within the limits of said Village without first having paid the sum of Three (\$3.00) Dollars for each male dog and for each spayed female dog and the sum of Five (\$5.00) Dollars for each unspayed female dog as a license tax thereon; provided that no license shall authorize the keeping, owning or harboring of more than one dog. Upon receipt of the amounts provided herein by the owner of a dog, the Village Pound Master to be appointed as hereinafter provided, shall issue a receipt therefor and shall also furnish a substantial tag bearing the words, "Village Dog Tax" and the year in and for which issued. The owner or keeper of such dog shall attach such tag to a collar to be worn by the dog for which such tax was issued during the time for which the license is to run and the Village Pound Master shall register such dog in a book kept by him for that purpose, in which shall be corded the owner's name, the time of payment for and the expiration of said license and the name, sex and color of the dog. All licenses shall extend to and expire on the thirtieth day of April of each year. Provided, further, that such license shall not allow the running at large of dogs by any harborer or owner from the fifteenth day of April of each year until the fifteenth day of June thereof, and, during such period, the running

at large of dogs is expressly prohibited and declared to be a misdemeanor and any person owning or harboring such dogs and allowing them to run at large during such period, violating the terms and provisions of this section, upon conviction for such violation shall be fined not less than One (\$1.00) Dollar nor more than Twenty-five (\$25.00) Dollars and costs of prosecution.

Section 2. There is hereby created the office of Village

Pound Master who shall be appointed by the Chairman by and with the
consent of the Board of Trustees, whose salary and term of
employment shall also be fixed by the Chairman by and with the
consent of the Board of Trustees and the duties of said officer
shall be as prescribed in this ordinance.

Section 3. It shall be the duty of the Village Pound Master to capture and impound any dog or dogs of either sex running at large in the Village of Clark Fork contrary to the provisions of this ordinance. When any dog has thus been captured and impounded, the Village Pound Master shall thereupon cause notice of such capture and impounding to be posted in three of the most conspicuous places in the Village and after at least forty-eight hours from the posting of said notices, shall sell said impounded dog to the highest bidder and pay the amount received into the Village Treasury.

Section 4. If the owner or harborer of any such dog who is thus taken by the Village Pound Master because of failure to pay the license tax on said dog as hereinabove provided, desires to redeem said dog, he may do so upon payment of the license tax and a fee of One (\$1.00) Dollar to be paid to said Village Pound Master. Dogs remaining unsold and unredeemed shall be destroyed by the Village Pound Master in as humane a manner as possible.

Section 5. If any owner or keeper of an unspayed female dog, shall knowingly permit her to run at large while in heat, not-

LAW OFFICES OF BANDELIN, BANDELIN & PONACK NEWS-BULLETIN BLDG, SANDPOINT, IDAHO withstanding such person may have a license for such dog as provided in this ordinance, such person shall upon conviction thereof, for each and every offense, be fined in the sum of not less than One (\$1.00) Dollar nor more than Ten (\$10.00) Dollars and costs of prosecution.

Section 6. The Village Pound Master shall be entitled to the sum of One (\$1.00) Dollar for each and every dog impounded and sold or destroyed by him under the provisions of this ordinance, said sums to be audited and paid out of the Village Treasury.

All monies received for licenses as provided herein shall be paid to the Village Treasurer.

Section 7. No person shall interfere or hinder the Village Pound Master in the performance of his duties and any person who does so interfere or hinder said officer in the performance of his duties shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be fined not less than Five (\$5.00) Dollars together with the costs of prosecution.

Section 8. Any person being the owner or harborer of any dog within the limits of the Village of Clark Fork who has not paid the license tax provided herein, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be fined not less than Five (\$5.00) Dollars nor more than Ten (\$10.00) Dollars and the costs of prosecution.

Section 9. Ordinance No. 9 of the Village of Clark Fork and any other ordinances in conflict herewith shall be and the same hereby are repealed.

Section 10. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage, approval and publication in one issue of the Sandpoint News-Bulletin, a newspaper of general circulation in the Village of Clark Fork, which is hereby designated as the official newspaper of the Village for the publication of this ordinance.
